**Bio**: Bobbie Irwin has been weaving since 1973 and teaching for guilds, conferences, shops and craft schools since 1986. She's taught in 40 states plus Canada and Australia. A former Contributing Editor to *Handwoven* and *Spin-Off* magazines, she was a longtime columnist and editorial assistant at Interweave. She's the author of four textile books and has had many dozens of articles published in craft and textile journals in three countries. She is a former member of Handweavers Guild of Boulder. Bobbie lives in Montrose, Colorado, and is a current member of the San Juan Weavers Guild. Research has always been one of her passions, and periodically she spends years studying some obscure aspect of weaving or spinning until she feels confident to write about it and teach it. Her most recent study, on iridescence in fabrics, has captured her interest since 2002, and is the topic of her latest book, *Weaving Iridescence: Color Play for the Handweaver* (Stackpole Books, 2017). Bobbie's workshops on iridescence have been her most popular since she started offering them in 2004.
