The Stricker Fund

The Handweavers Guild of Boulder established a scholarship fund in 1992 and named it in honor of Carol Strickler who passed away in April of that year. Carol Strickler was a member of the Handweavers Guild of Boulder from 1967, when she discovered weaving, until her death. Her contributions to the organization and to the craft were extraordinary.

The Carol Strickler Scholarship Fund was established to provide a monetary award to any qualified member of the Handweavers Guild of Boulder to assist in their technical and aesthetic development. Carol was a teacher and mentor who found joy in sharing her craft with others. In that spirit of sharing, recipients of the scholarship are requested to share their experience with other guild members.

Members can donate items to be sold at the sale with the proceeds going to the Strickler fund. The following pages describe how to do this.

Before the Sale

If you are not participating in the sale but have items you want to donate, contact the Strickler committee to arrange your donation.

If you are selling items at the sale, you will need to enter all Strickler items into the Artist Data Entry program with the rest of your inventory. Like your other inventory items, you will need to print a label to attach to your item and to be included in your inventory check-in.

When you add the item, be sure to check on the “Donate item to Strickler” checkbox.

The item will show up on your inventory sheet as a STRICKLER DONATION.

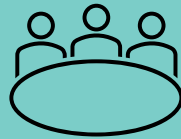

At the Strickler table, they will

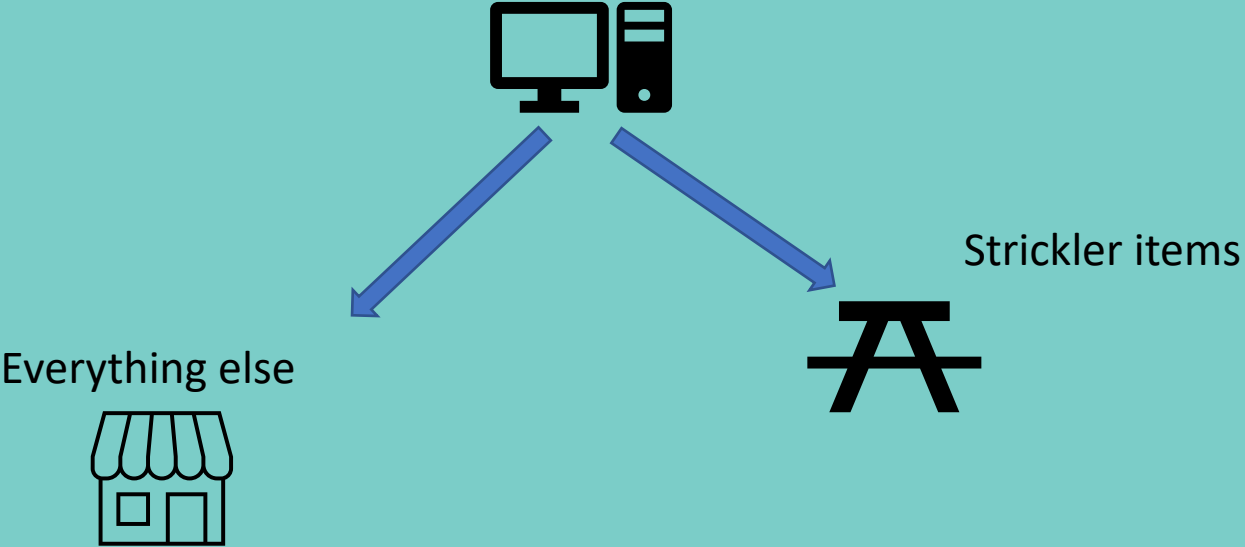
- Log your item
- Stamp the label of your item to indicate it is a Strickler Donation.
- And stamp your Inventory sheet to indicate the item has been donated.

You will take all your items including the Strickler items to the next step of the check in process where your item will be verified by Standards and checked in to the computer point of sale system.

After all items are checked in, you will put your Strickler items into a special staging area behind the computers. The rest of your items will go out on the sale floor.



Before the sale begins, your Strickler donations will be moved to the Strickler account in the point-of-sale system. All proceeds from selling your items will go directly to Strickler.

At the end of the Sale

If you gave your donations to the Strickler Committee, you will need to contact them to get any items that didn't sell.

If you did participate in the sale, you are responsible at check-out for checking the sale floor Strickler table to pick up any items that have not sold.

If you wish to donate them in the next year's sale, you will need to add them back to the Artist Data Entry program in the new year and print out a new tag.
